LETTER FROM THE CEO W LORENZO GOMEZ, III

THERE IS NO GREATER FORM OF PHILANTHROPY THAN FOR SOMEONE TO CREATE A JOB FOR ANOTHER PERSON. IN THAT SENSE OUR COMPANIES ARE SOME OF THE GREATEEST PHILANTRHOPISTS THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO HAS EVER SEEN.

Dear Community:

In 2011, Graham Weston and Nick Longo were on a plane coming back from a national coworking tour. They hit every major and minor coworking space they could find at the time to learn and take notes. They came back to San Antonio with two things etched in granite.

First, the coworking space they were about to create would be 'collaborative' before all else. Most places were just spaces you could rent a desk or office or pop open your laptop and work. This would be a place where entrepreneurs could wrestle with their fears and doubts and truly build special things working together.

Second, Graham and Nick knew they would need a great name for their space. "Geekdom," was Nick's instant response. There was no pause or doubt, just the knowledge that they would build a kingdom where Geeks could congregate, learn, and build awesome things together.

The building they chose for Geekdom was very significant. The Weston Centre at 112 East Pecan has a rich technology history that will one day warrant a historical marker outside the building. This was the birthplace of Rackspace in 1999, and when Rackspace outgrew their 6th floor space, they moved out and turned that floor into their main production data center. Several years later, one of Rackspace's investors, Sequoia Capital, called Graham and said they had just funded a new startup called YouTube and needed to put up 10 servers overnight. That night, the first servers of newly funded YouTube came online inside the Weston Centre.

Fast-forward to 2011, when Geekdom opened its doors and tech magic happened once again. The next generation of companies stepped into the Weston Centre and began their journey. Some of these included Parlevel Systems, Codeup, Grok, Merge VR, The Rivard Report, Promoter.io and HelpSocial.

Five years later, the time has come for us to take a pause from our ecosystem work and tally the scorecard. What have we all accomplished together? How many jobs have we created? How much funding has been raised? These are questions I get asked often by reporters and people who come to learn from what we have built together. The report that follows is Geekdom's way of presenting the exciting answers to those questions and more. Not only did we outgrow the Weston Centre, take over the Rand Building and fill it with tech companies, but we also kicked off an urban renaissance that will transform San Antonio's downtown into a tech hub for decades to come.

This report is something that I am immensely proud of because it was a team effort. Geekdom does not create jobs or raise money; we make sure the soda machine is full and that we are here to serve our members in any way we can. Sometimes that means walking one member over to another member and saying, "You two need to meet."

The companies at Geekdom have carried this place and have created the forward momentum in this ecosystem. I am convinced that there is no greater form of philanthropy than for someone to create a job for another person. In that sense our companies are some of the greatest philanthropists the city of San Antonio has ever seen.

The ecosystem that has emerged along Houston St. is for us —men, women, young, old, veteran, disabled, and more. Many of the companies in this report were started by people who grew up in San Antonio or graduated from a San Antonio university. We are proud that our tech scene is a place for people of all backgrounds.

Now that we're at the Geekdom five-year mark, I'm grateful for the vision that Graham Weston and Nick Longo gave us. And I know that the next five years will be the ones in which the rest of America and the world get on a plane to come to study us. We will soon be on the list of must-see coworking spots for those who wish to kickstart their cities' startup ecosystems. They will look at this report and know that we have been pretty busy for the last half decade.

I hope you enjoy Geekdom as much as I have.







Supporting educational outlets that employ innovative instruction methods for individuals who desire to be proficient in tech within months.


